LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

Let me begin by saying thanks - thank you for your support, partnership and prayer, and for sharing the story of the new things God is growing through Act Five.

At the graduation ceremony for our 5th Gap Year cohort last April, a parent of one of our students approached me. She spoke of how the transformation in her daughter through time with Act Five had spread into their

home and family in more ways than she could express and far more than she could have imagined.

This story and the many like it get to the heart of why the invitation on offer in Act Five matters in today's world. They speak to the rippling impact of real transformation.

Act Five's mandate – preparing young people for life in the world as rooted & engaged disciples of Jesus – responds to real and pressing concerns about the trends among emerging young adults. Act Five is quite literally rewiring the brains of young people and setting their feet on solid ground (see *The Anxious Generation* by J. Haidt). What is more, the transformation that we

are witnessing in our participants is flowing outwards: into their home communities, among our missional partners, and into new neighbourhoods, churches and workplaces.

What we are witnessing is the confirmation that we must invest in communities of formation if we are to lead to real change in the world. We do not need more content or quick, measurable activities. True "impact" will grow if we do the real, slow, personal work of investing in young people's lives.

The stories, updates and invitations that you find in this report speak to what God has been doing among Act Five. May you experience hope as you read this. We are immeasurably grateful that you have chosen to be a part of this story. With the support of our broadening community we will continue to guide, invite, and equip young people in the Way of Jesus.

THE STORY WITHIN THE NAME

The name **Act Five** comes from our core belief that the Bible is the True Story of the whole world, and that the Christian life is about finding our place IN that story. It helps to break it down into six acts:

ACT ONE:

The beginning of the story, of God creating heaven and earth, coming to dwell with his people in the garden.

ACT TWO:

The story of the fall, of the serpent's deceit and the introduction of evil, shame and greed into the story.

ACT THREE:

The story of God walking with his people, Israel, repeatedly extending grace and working to redeem and restore. The people lose the story often but God remains faithful.

ACT FOUR:

The coming of Jesus, in his life, death and resurrection — showing the way for others to follow, the way of the cross.

ACT FIVE We find ourselves here, with a starting point and communities to learn from but no script. We are asked to work out our faith in community, to practice it. We depend on grace and the Holy Spirit, and we long for the final act.

ACT SIX:

This is the vision of where the story is going, with images that fuel hope in the new heavens and new earth, where all of creation is restored.

OUR INITIATIVES

Act Five is more than a gap year! Here are some of the key programs we offer.



GAP YEAR PROGRAM

The 8-month program has been designed to stretch 18-20 year olds through new experiences, places, and relationships within a Christian community. While living together in a home, students explore their faith and who they are through learning, service, and adventure.



RESIDENCY PROGRAM

The Residency Program provides a formative community living experience for young adults who are pursuing work or study in the city of Hamilton through shared participation in the Act Five learning community.



SERVE & OBSERVE

Act Five's Serve and Observe trips provide high school students with service and learning experiences in Hamilton. These 2-3 day trips are designed to inspire youth and their leaders or teachers to serve, grow in character, and engage their faith in meaningful ways.



STORYTELLING NIGHTS

Throughout the year, we host Evenings with Storytellers. We open doors to the public to listen to stories of those who have meaningfully wrestled with living out their faith in different contexts in our world.




SPAGHETTI WEDNESDAYS




FINANCIAL REPORT

2023-2024 REVENUE
